REURAIRTEL APRIL TWENTY-FOUR LAST ENCLOSING LETTERHEAD MEMORANDUM
 SAME DATE SETTING FORTH RESULTS OF YOUR INTERVIEW WITH JOSEPH P.
 GREENMAN. PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION REQUESTED BY LETTER MAY TWELVE LAST
 THAT BUREAU INTERVIEW H. R. BRIGBT, EDGAR CRISBY AND NELSON DUNNER
 HUNT, THE THREE PERSONS IDENTIFIED BY GREENMAN AS CONTRIBUTORS TO THE
 FUND WHICH WAS USED IN PAYMENT FOR THE ADVERTISEMENT WHICH APPEARED
 IN QUOTE THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS UNQUOTE NOVEMBER TWENTY-TWO LAST.
 COMMISSION STATED IT DESIRED TO KNOW, IN FACT, WHETHER THESE THREE
 MEN DID CONTRIBUTE TO THE FUND AND WHETHER THE MONEY SO CONTRIBUTED
 REPRESENTED THEIR OWN FUNDS OR WAS SUPPLIED BY OTHER PERSONS.
 COMMISSION STATED IT DESIRED THESE THREE MEN BE INTERROGATED GENERALLY
 REGARDING THEIR KNOWLEDGE RELATING TO THE PLACEMENT OF THIS ADVERTISE-
 MENT. COMMISSION ALSO STATED IT DESIRED EACH OF THESE THREE
 INDIVIDUALS BE ASKED AS TO ANY CONTACTS EACH MAY HAVE HAD WITH EITHER
 LEE HARVEY OSWALD OR JACK L. RUBY. COMMISSION FURTHER REQUESTED THAT
 IF OTHER CONTRIBUTORS TO THE FUND ARE IDENTIFIED, IT DESIRED SUCH

BRIGHT, CRISSEY AND HUNT. YOU SHOULD IMMEDIATELY INTERVIEW BRIGHT,
CRISSEY AND HUNT IN ACCORDANCE WITH COMMISSION'S REQUEST. RESULTS
OF SUCH INTERVIEWS SHOULD BE IMMEDIATELY FURNISHED TO BUREAU IN
LETTERHEAD MEMORANDUM FORM SUITABLE FOR DISSEMINATION TO THE
PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION.

NOTE:

"Dallas Morning News" on the morning of 11/22/63 carried advertisement entitled "Welcome, Mr. Kennedy to Dallas," which was signed by the "American Fact Finding Committee, Bernard Weisman, Chairman, Post Office Box 1792, Dallas 21, Texas." We learned the money for this add was solicited by Joseph P. Grinnan, Dallas independent oil man. At request of the President's Commission we interviewed Mr. Grinnan 4/20/64 to determine the names of the contributors to this add. On 4/24/64 Mr. Grinnan stated the money, approximately \$1500 was contributed by H. E. Bright, independent oil operator in Dallas; Edgar Crissey, insurance man in Dallas; and Nelson Barker Hunt, an independent oil man in Dallas who is the son of E. L. Hunt, a well-known oil man in Dallas. Grinnan stated he did not know the amounts each of the contributors gave to the fund and felt each may have solicited funds from others for the payment for the add. Grinnan stated he himself did not contribute to the fund. We disseminated results of our interview with Grinnan to the President's Commission by letter 4/29/64. Commission has now requested we interview Bright, Crissey and Hunt in this matter and any others who may have contributed to the add through these three men.
