Any information developed regarding the identification of informant JOHN P. Kennedy should be submitted under that caption.

Handle promptly.

NOTE:

Subject, while in a tavern in East Orange, New Jersey, 1/1/64, claimed that he was a communist and had been involved in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. He was overheard by two police officers to state that he was a communist but these officers did not hear any reference to the assassination of President Kennedy by Dublin. One of the interviewing police officers stated that Dublin was possibly in need of psychiatric care. Copies of the 1/1/64 letterhead memorandum were disseminated by Newark locally and a copy has been forwarded to Secret Service Headquarters.
