Enclosed is a copy of a letter bearing the name Alice Whiteley which was furnished to this Bureau by letter dated June 23, 1964, from Mr. Herbert J. Miller, Jr., Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, U. S. Department of Justice.

Mrs. Whiteley has corresponded with this Bureau since 1957. However, her letters have not been acknowledged due to the rambling, incoherent information contained in her communications.

On March 30, 1960, Mrs. Whiteley was interviewed by a Special Agent of the FBI at this Bureau's headquarters. She appeared to be a woman of more than sixty years of age. At that time Mrs. Whiteley left a paper she prepared so that the FBI could investigate the crimes set forth in the document. It contained a rambling dissertation regarding psychiatric therapists, Al Capone, the Mafia, Kremlin agents, perversions and hypnotism, all of which did not make sense.

A copy of Mrs. Whiteley's current letter has been furnished to the President's Commission and this Bureau is taking no further action.

Bureau files reveal Mrs. Whiteley has corresponded with us since 1957 and it appears she is a deeply mentally disturbed individual. She has presented lengthy written letters regarding psychiatric therapists, Al Capone, the Mafia, perversions, hypnotism, Kremlin agents, none of which make sense. She appeared at the Bureau on March 30, 1960, to present one of these lengthy letters and it was the observation of the interviewing Agent that she was a woman of more than 60 years of age. We have not acknowledged any of her previous communications and in view of the fact the Department has not acknowledged this one, we therefore, are not acknowledging it. A copy of Mrs. Whiteley's letter is being furnished to the President's Commission investigating the assassination.
