NOTE: Bureau received a letter from Frank J. Geyer of Chicago, Illinois, alleging he knew information about the assassination and claimed that Senator Goldwater would be assassinated on the same day President Kennedy was. Geyer during interview on 7-30-64, admitted writing this letter, states he is retired and spends most of his time thinking about politics and the world situation. He said he is able to "dream" about a problem and come up with the solution. He had no information of value concerning the assassination and claimed the information in his letter was strictly his opinion. In view of Geyer's reference to President Johnson, the late President, Kennedy and Senator Goldwater, appropriate dissemination has been made to the Secret Service and Senator Goldwater's Office.
