Pages A4488-A4489. Congressman Schadeberg, (D) Wisconsin, spoke regarding the report on the assassination of President Kennedy and stated "Since the investigation was made by a duly presidentially appointed committee and staffing paid by tax funds, it is unthinkable and unconscionable to even suggest that the findings be sold to the public." Mr. Schadeberg placed in the Record an editorial from the Janesville (Wisconsin) Daily Gazette of August 13th captioned "A Price on Kennedy Tragedy." The editorial states that in the investigation of the President's death "No corner, no personality, no motive could be hidden from this probe-in-depth, backed by all the vast facilities of the FBI or any other Federal agency as might be required."
