NOTE: The Commission's request in this matter was followed continuously, resulting in conferences held with Redlich on July 23, 1964 (Memo, Gauthier to Callahan 7-24-64). A preliminary chart was submitted to Redlich on 7-28-64 at which time he decided to hold this matter in abeyance until such time as the Commission could furnish additional information. This matter was again discussed with Redlich on 8-12-64 and on 8-26-64. He approved the preliminary charts. It is to be noted that all materials selected by the Commission for visual aids are basically subject matter already submitted to the Commission by the FBI prepared in report volumes, visual aids, scale models, etc. Indications are the requests for visual aids will continue until all information needed for the preparation of the Commission's final report has been submitted with possible extensions to cover additions to and modifications of material already submitted right up to the time of final printing. Requests for visual aids are being made by report writers approved by Mr. Rankin for additional graphic illustrations which will be used to clarify obscure technical points which will appear in the final report.
