Secret Service, called Malley today and advised he had been in touch with J. Lee Rankin, General Counsel, President's Commission, late on the afternoon of 9/1/64, and Rankin stated he was going to DC accompany Senators John Sherman Cooper (R.-Ky.) and Richard By Russell (D.-Ga. and Congressman Hale Boggs (D.-Ga.), to Dallas on Sunday, 9/6/64, leaving Andrews Field in a Jet Star Presidential Plane at 9:00 a.m., and would probably return to Washington the same evening. Kelley indicated that Rankin requested that he, Kelley, advise Malley of this trip in order that consideration could be given to whether or not Malley would accompany the aforementioned individuals to Dallas. nc Following receipt of this information from Inspector Kelley, Malley talked with Rankin, at which time Mr. Rankin stated that there was no real purpose 1 for Malley making the above-mentioned trip unless he desired to do so. He stated. that Senator Russell and Congressman Boggs had not previously been to Dallas and were desirous of making a firsthand check of the various locations of interest in Dallas. In addition, Mr. Rankin advised that since Senators Cooper and Russell were of the opinion there were a number of questions which should be asked of Mrs. Marina Oswald which were not asked when she appeared before the President's Commission to furnish testimony, they desired to interview her in Dallas under oath rather than have her again return to Washington for testimony. RECOMMENDATION: Based on the information made available by Mr. Rankin, there does not appear to be any reason for Malley to make the above-mentioned trip to Dallas on Sunday 9/6/64.
