the Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. The referral from
the Department of Justice did not include the envelope:

TRUE COPY

To Robert F. Kennedy.

Just a few lines to let you know
that Lee Harvey Oswald was not the only one
involved in the assassination of the
President (Kennedy) There were others
involved besides him. Oswald was nominated
to do the job. Others were the master
minds, to tell him how to do the job &
when to do it & where to do it. I am
giving you some names who are responsible
or can shed some light on the assassination

The above documents were examined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory and Identification Division with the following results:

(a) Both letters were written by the same individual. The envelope which was received with the letter addressed to Walter Winchell was also written by the same individual.

(b) The watermark "Fifth Avenue", which appears on two pages of the letter received by Mr. Winchell, is handled exclusively by the F. W. Woolworth Stores.

The documents were also examined by the Latent Fingerprint Section of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and no impressions of value were developed.

On August 12, 1964, Doctor Erich Kaufman, Supervising Psychiatrist of Buildings C and D, Kings Park State Hospital, Kings Park, Long Island, advised that he reads all patients outgoing mail. He stated, however, that it was very easy for a patient to get a letter out of the hospital without his knowledge.

On August 20, 1964, Doctor Kaufman was shown copies of the above letters, however, he was unable to identify the handwriting. He stated that none of the names appearing in the anonymous letters had ever been patients or employees at this mental institution.

Doctor Kaufman also advised that there are approximately 657 mental patients in Buildings C and D, and none of them could be interviewed because of their mental conditions.

On August 27, 1964, [Mr. Frank Kowalski] 6209 39th Avenue, Woodside, Long Island, was interviewed and advised that he was in the United States Army during the Korean War.

Mr. Kowalski stated that the writing in the anonymous letters was not familiar to him. He also stated that none of the names listed in these letters were known to him.

Mr. Kowalski stated that neither he nor his wife have any relatives or friends who are patients at the Kings Park State Hospital.

The New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation was unable to locate the other individuals for interview who were from the New York City area which were listed in the anonymous letters.
