SAs SCHOENECKER and BABLER have been admonished for their errors and a notation of this action recorded in their personnel folder.

It is not recommended that any additional action be taken against these Agents in this instance.

DELINQUENCY

It was necessary for the Bureau on three occasions, 7/23/64, 8/4/64, and 8/11/64, to communicate with the Milwaukee Office in order to obtain a suitable letterhead memorandum concerning an anonymous letter which was referred to Milwaukee for investigation. This matter was handled by SA Robert E. Schoenecker and supervised by a Relief Supervisor Eugene G. Babler. The letterhead memorandum submitted contained typographical errors and did not comply with specific Bureau instructions. Milwaukee instructed to submit explanations and recommendations.

EXPLANATIONS OF SAC, MILWAUKEE

Both Agents state that four of the typing errors were inadvertently overlooked and that one other error was occasioned by misinterpretation of Bureau instructions. They state every effort will be made to prevent similar errors in the future. SAC, Milwaukee, advises both men have been orally admonished for the errors and a notation of this action has been placed in their personnel folders. SAC recommends no further action.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF GENERAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

Milwaukee's errors could have been avoided by more diligent attention to administrative detail. However, the delay in obtaining a suitable letterhead memorandum has not adversely affected this investigation, nor is it one of substance. It is felt the oral admonishment, the noting of this action in the Agent's personnel folders, and the necessity for furnishing written explanations for these derelictions will have the desired effect of making these Agents more alert in the future. No further action appears warranted and none is recommended.
