## Striking New York Printers Break Publishers' Front as Post Resumes Publication

NEW YORK, March 6 — The militant perseverance of New York City's printers achieved an important breakthrough on March 6 when the lock-out carried on by four of the city's newspapers for 36 days was breached by the New York Post's resumption of publication.

When Typographical Union No. 6 struck four newspapers in this city last Dec. 8, the New York Post and other major dailies had
