MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

ReDLairtel and enclosed letterhead memorandum dated 9/15/64, relating to Clifton M. Shastoon.

The following revisions are necessary before your letterhead memorandum and attachments can be disseminated.

1.) In paragraph 3 of your letterhead memorandum, line 1, after word 2, you should insert "reports of" or "results of". Submit revised page.

2.) In the FD-302 on Bert Elmo Glover you do not specifically indicate whether Glover ever saw the individual whom he believed to be identical with Oswald use a vehicle. In view of the specific Commission request with regard to the automobile, it is suggested that an appropriate statement be added to this FD-302, if such is the case, that Glover did or did not ever see this individual utilizing an automobile. Further, in paragraph 2, line 6, it would appear word 4 should be "sharp". Submit revised page.

3.) In the FD-302 on Buddy Law, paragraph 2, line 3, the Bureau is changing word 2 to "on". Correct your copies accordingly.

4.) In the FD-302 on Clifton M. Shastoon, paragraph 2, last word, line 9, is not clear, inasmuch as it could refer to Shastoon or Hallmark. The Bureau will insert after the last word "Shastoon". Correct your copies accordingly.

RE: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

For your information, "barbershop" is one word and will be changed by the Bureau wherever used other than the revised pages which will be changed by you.

The above revised pages should be promptly prepared and submitted so dissemination can be effected.

It is pointed out Oswald, during his week-end stays at Irving, Texas, stayed at Ruth Paine's. If not already done, Dallas should consider interview with Ruth Paine to determine if she ever recalls Oswald going for a haircut on a week-end during October or November, 1963, and if so, who would be a logical 14 or 15-year old boy in the neighborhood who might have accompanied him.

Dallas is reminded that this and other matters will be disseminated to the President's Commission and subsequent reporting is not required or desirable.

Note:

The information from Dallas was furnished as a result of a Commission request. Briefly, this phase of the Commission's request deals with an allegation that a barber in Irving, Texas, claimed Oswald had visited his shop on three occasions. One other barber substantiated this, however, no other information has been developed to indicate Oswald was in this barbershop. When the results are received, the Commission will be appropriately advised.
