This is the 27th letter to the Commission on Martin who is the subject of SAC Letter 64-23(B) dated 4-28-64, based on her prolific letter writing campaign to vilify the Director and the FBI. Based on a Commission request, we inter-viewed Martin on 9-17-64 for approximately 10 minutes at which time she refused to furnish any information. The Commission was furnished the results of this interview by our letter dated 9/22/64. Oklahoma City has now received two communications from Martin, one of which is rather comical. In the interview on 9-17-64 our Agents remarked they had considerable difficulty getting into her residence as there were a number of vicious dogs present. Nevertheless, they conducted the interview. One of the communications just received from Martin makes reference to this situation and states that while the FBI failed to protect the President in Dallas, she, nevertheless, was pleased that two of our Agents (Oklahoma City Office) walked through her yerd where she has eight dogs. Of course, she is being extremely sarcastic. The other communication from Oklahoma City is a copy of a letter she presumably sent to the Commission explaining why she did not furnish any information to the FBI and berating the Commission for not answering her prior communications and not sending a representative to take a deposition from her. 

It appears Mrs. Martin is becoming more emotionally disturbed as time goes on.
