MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

The following supplements a memorandum dated September 18, 1964, covering an interview of Mrs. Mark E. (Shirley) Martin of Hominy, Oklahoma, an interview which had been requested by Mr. Howard P. Willens of the President's Commission, concerning a telegram which Mrs. Martin directed to the Commission relative to the "strange time sequence of shots" which she indicated negated use of the Italian rifle.

On September 21, 1964, the Oklahoma City Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation received a communication from Mrs. Martin, postmarked September 18, 1964, at Hominy, Oklahoma, addressed to "Mr. Teague, Mr. Barry and Mr. Long, Federal Agents, FBI, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma," with the return address, "566 Hominy, Oklahoma." The communication consisted of an unaddressed and undated memorandum concerning circumstances of the interview of Mrs. Martin on September 18, 1964, and a copy of a two-page letter which Mrs. Martin had directed to James Lee Rankin of the Warren Commission. Copies of each are included hereinafter.
