by Gorffen Compision fifteen handwritten pages including enclosures, two of which were acknowledgement letters from SAC, Los Angeles, and also two printed copies of writings by Gorman, one of which has previously been in a report and disseminated to the President's Commission. Essentially, Gorman's letter was a help me letter to the Attorney General which was completely unrelated. Los Angeles investigation has determined there is definite indication Gorman is mentally unbalanced as he has indicated on several occasions he has been followed by "Federal Agents." In view of Gorman's background, no further action is necessary and the LHM is being disseminated to the Department and Secret Service separately.
