The following investigation was conducted at Long Eeach, California, on September 15, 1964 :

The files of the Long Beach Police Department (LBPD) were caused to be checked and no record identifiable with Leo A. Gorman was located.

Detective Sergeant Ray Henry, Anti-Subversive Detail, LBPD, advised his files contained no information identifiable with Gorman.

Long Beach Credit Association files contained a credit report dated June 29, 1962, ror Leo A. Gorman, age 29, listed as single as of 1962, residence 3712 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California (seven months as of June 29, 1962).

This report indicated former residences as 3942 8th Street, San Diego, California (one year) and 14 Clifford Place, Brooklyn, New York. His occupation was listed as designer and mechanical engineer, North American Aviation, Douney, Calirornia; former employment - General Dynamics, New York City. His -.military service was in the U. S. Army, 1958-1961.

The last inquiry, according to the file, was dated September 13, 1962, at which time residence address was changed to 4944 Hayter, Lons Beach, California.

On September 16, 1964, an effort was made to locate and interview Gorman at 3712 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California. Mr. Gorman was not in his room during the entire day.
 managing of the Park Hotel, 3712 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, for her friend, Mrs. Rustermeyer, was contacted. She said she had been there about two weeks and during that time had become acquainted with Leo Gorman. She said he did not have any employment and spent most or his time reading various religious books and writing letters. She volunteered that she considered him in need of medical attention for mental reasons. She said she had been a nurse for many years at the California State Hospital for the Mentally Ill at Norwalk, California, is a registered nurse, and in her opinion, Mr. Gorman is mentally unbalanced.
 Manager, Park Hotel, 3712 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, 14 California, advised that she had known Leo Gorman ror about 14 or 15 months. She said Gorman was supposedly previousiy employed at the North American Aviation Company, Downey, California. She volunteered that she considered bim ndingy,
 Investigations Oirice, Horth American Aviation, Douney, Calirornia, advised that Leo A. Corman of 3712 East Anaheim street, Long Beach, California, had been employed at that plant from May ${ }_{3}$ 1962, until April 9, 1964. He was persuaded to resign at that time as his supervisors had repeatediy stated, in the last few months before his resignation, that he had become incapable mentally of concentrating on his work and continuously made weird complaints of being rollowed and investigated.
 such, but did interview Gorman prior to his termination. During this interview, Gorman gave several instances of when he - believed he was followed by "Federal Agents." He said that he belleved every theater box office in the Los Angeles area had his photograph and had instructions to have him sit in a certain location in the theater.
