Enclosed for your information are two copies of a memorandum captioned "Assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, November 22, 1963, Dallas, Texas," dated September 18, 1964, Omaha, Nebraska. The memorandum contains information concerning one Warren Egbert Hefflon who following arrest for a Federal violation claimed he killed President Kennedy.

NOTE:

By airtel 9-18-64, Omaha furnished a letterhead memorandum concerning Warren Egbert Hefflon who was arrested September 15, 1964, in violation of Title 18, Section 2312, (ITS'V). Following his arrest he was very uncooperative, would not allow himself to be printed by the U. S. Marshal and also made irrational statements. He claimed he was deaf and was unable to hear the U. S. Marshal. He further stated he was going to avail himself to all the "foolish rights" bestowed upon him by the Government. While in the Marshal's Office observed a picture of the President, at which time he said "I killed him." [redacted] stated [redacted] believes [redacted] is a mental case and that he had told [redacted] he intended to "take" mental instability. The USA is giving serious consideration to requesting a psychiatric examination of Hefflon. We formerly had a [selective service case] on Hefflon, and [redacted] several referrals on deserter cases. The Commission is being furnished the copy of an Identification Record regarding Hefflon.
