On October 23, 1964, Dr. Newman T. Reed, Head of English Department, New Lexico State University (NLSU), University Park, New Mexico, furnished a letter to an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, postmarked at Las Cruces, New Mexico, October 22, 1964, addressed to Dr. Reed, care of NLSU English Department, Young Hall, University Park, New Mexico. The letter reads as follows: Mexico. The letter reads
"Dear (?) Sir:

"Having heard of your millions of rumors, lies, et cetera, you have used as tools in discrediting many fine professors, we all think that it is about time for you to stop and reconsider. Notably your own department, in which for years you and Dr. IMRDEAN and have gone beyond limits to corrupt and destroy.

"When freedom loving New Mexican patriots like I Tearn that communist-sympathizers like you-four are in the most important department on campus, how you have tried tirelessly to wreck the lives of certain English professors in the past, have put pressure on them to resign due to their "Lack of a Ph.D." It's MOST interesting how you can tell them 'You won't get tenure anyplace till you have your Ph.D' when doesn't have one.

Dr. Reed stated that
