While it would appear that the information initially received from one "B. J. James" is identical with the most recent communication, Dallas is reminded that no definite conclusion can be reached until the Bureau Laboratory has had an opportunity to examine and compare both communications. If at all possible the earlier communication received by Governor John Connally should be submitted for Laboratory examination.

For the information of receiving offices, U. S. Secret Service Headquarters was orally advised of the contents of the letter bearing the name "B. R. James" and dated "October 14, 1864." Receiving offices should likewise advise Secret Service locally of the contents of this letter; and confirm with follow-up LHM which will be prepared by Dallas.

After the results of any Laboratory examination made are received, Dallas is instructed to make specific recommendations concerning the desirability of making efforts to identify B. R. James.
