Dear Mr. Hoover:

Although it is difficult to believe that almost a year has passed since November 22, 1963, it is nonetheless true. We find the passage of time has somewhat numbed the realities of that day.

An almost endless amount of books, pictures, poems, souvenirs, etc., have emerged representing the memorabilia of that tragic occasion. However, little has been written or said concerning the moments subsequent to that fateful day and the horrendous problems implicit in the transition of leadership in government.

The enclosed album is a dialogue between significant journalists and a public figure whose responsibilities involved them deeply in the events of that time despite the grief the nation felt. These records are an actual program that appeared on the air of Group W's radio stations. It is my conviction they fill a significant gap in the total story and I trust you will find them of interest and meaning.

I would greatly appreciate your reactions and assessment even if they be negative since I am confident we could learn measurably by such response.
