NOTE: Philadelphia furnished information from informant [REDACTED] of unknown reliability, who alleges an integrated interstate gang hired Oswald and two others to assassinate President Kennedy. It is significant that the reported main perpetrator was shot and killed on 10/26/64, and also that [REDACTED]

gives indications of lying. It is pointed out we have never developed information indicating anyone other than Oswald involved in assassination. Philadelphia has requested polygraph examination of [REDACTED] who has orally (Note continued next page)
