For information of all Offices and Bureau, the following information is set forth:

[redacted] when interviewed by SA's THOMAS F. HANNIGAN and C. HEBER SMITH on 11/12/64, as set forth in enclosed LHM, outlined details indicating that he believed that WILLIAM DE LOATCH, more commonly known as Billy DeLoatch (now deceased), was part of a "syndicate," which was responsible for the assassination of President KENNEDY in Dallas, Texas, 11/22/63. The Bureau was requested and granted authority to afford [redacted] confined in the [redacted] Prison, [redacted] Pa., a polygraph interview.

On 11/17/64, [redacted] was reinterviewed by SA's J. ROBERT PEARCE, JOSEPH A. VERICA, and C. HEBER SMITH. In this interview, which is also a part of the enclosed LHM and is set forth in FD-302 of 11/17/64, [redacted] admits that all of his original information was based on assumptions. As he expressed it, "It didn't take long to put two and two together," meaning that (1) DE LOATCH was out of town 11/22/63, and (2) President KENNEDY was dead.

[redacted] point by point, admitted that information previously received was based on assumption on his part, and he altered some of the original information during the reinterview, resulting in no need to afford [redacted] a polygraph interview.

It is pointed out that each item originally furnished by [redacted] in regard to the assassination of President KENNEDY has been covered in this reinterview; and, accordingly, he will not be afforded a polygraph interview, UACB.

No further investigation, UACB, being conducted concerning this matter.

Offices receiving copies of referenced communications, UACB, conduct no additional investigation.
