He stated that none of Cswald's actions showed he was a threat to the President or that he was dangerous. The FBI did not know of his psychiatric treatment in New York until after the assassination. He stated that on the day at the assassination the bolice went into the building where Cswald worked, accompanied by a building employee. They encountered Cswald, at which time the building employee identified Cswald as an employee of the building with no further explanation.

The next question was whether the FEI was still investige ag the Kennedy aspassination. Mr. Boover stated, "Yes-as long as any and tional evidance is received."

I reporter inquired as to the Director's opinion as to whether the National cross was cut of line in coverage of the merder of Lee Harvey Oswald by Jack & Take. We Director replied that with respect to the entire assassination matter there had been entreme unwarranked criticism of the press. He stated that the FBI never has any difficulty in working with the press. The explained that cur policy was "no comment" will a case is solved. The Director role of that, of course, the Dahas police should not g have allowed the press in the basement of the building when Oswall was being removed.
