SUBJECT: KENNEDY ASSASSINATION FILM

Reference is made to my memorandum dated 10/12/64. (62-109000-321). At that time, CIA inquired if the Bureau could make available to CIA a copy of a film which portrayed the assassination of President Kennedy. CIA was referring to the film which was taken by Abelian Zapruder, who sold the film to Life Magazine. The Bureau was furnished a copy by Zapruder prior to his negotiations with Life. CIA informed us that the Agency desired to use the film strictly for training purposes and if made available by the Bureau, it would be done with the understanding that it was being furnished on a loan basis.

When CIA made this request in October, 1964, the Liaison Agent, per instructions, informed CIA that the film was an exhibit of the Warren Commission and that the Agency should take up this matter with the Commission. On 11/27/64, [redacted] CIA, advised the Liaison Agent that her Agency had conferred with Mr. Alfred Goldberg of the Warren Commission. Goldberg has informed CIA that the Commission has no objection to the Bureau making a copy of the film available to CIA under the conditions described above.

ACTION:

This matter is being referred to the attention of the Laboratory. If approved, a copy of the referenced film will be made available to CIA on a loan basis with a clear understanding that the Agency would use the film only for training purposes as indicated.
