RE MRS. MARK E. MARTIN--INFORMATION CONCERNING

On February 8, 1965, Mr. Arthur L. Burnett, Criminal Division, Department of Justice, telephonically contacted the General Investigative Division regarding communications he had received from Mrs. Mark E. Martin.

This information was referred to SA Kenneth M. Raupach who returned Mr. Burnett's call and it was determined that Mr. Burnett had left his office for the balance of the day.

On February 9, 1965, Mr. Burnett was contacted telephonically at which time he advised he had received some communications from Mrs. Mark E, Martin which in substance indicated Mrs. Martin wanted to know why she was being investigated by the FBI.

Mrs. Martin is well known to the Bureau and was the subject of SAC letter 64-23 (B) dated 4/28/64. During the course of the investigation concerning the assassination, she directed numerous communications to the Bureau, President's Commission, and various news media.

A brief synopsiscollicerning Mrs. Martin's prolific interviewed at the specific martin and the fact that she had been interviewed at the specific request of the President's Commission and related material all of which was furnished to the President's Commission was explained to Mr. Burnett.

18 FEB 12 1965 Mr. Burnett said he surmised this was the situation and he had no intention of acknowledging Mrs. Martin's communications; however, he expressed his appreciation for the appropriate information. Mr. Burnett was specifically lifor the appropriate information. advised that Mrs. Martin was not being investigated by the FBI.
