Assassination pictures in Life and in the Warren Report
silently accuse her (1) of being responsible for the death of
JFK in that she held him up and (2) of perjury in that she said
she would have pulled him down if she had not been looking the
other way.

Credit is due to all who kept this from the grieving U. S.
nation for months, but now as the execution date for Jack Ruby
approaches, simple justice demands some answers, -- if there
is any justice in our democracy; do we have two laws, one for
the rich, one for the poor?

If Mrs. Kennedy is innocent, you owe it to her to print in
your magazine some explanation of the following: The expression
of genuine surprise is involuntary and cannot be controlled. It
is to be seen in the face of the officer who was holding Oswald
when he was shot. But not in that of Mrs. Kennedy when her hus-
band was shot. Unaware of the camera, she was as calm and composed
as if she were receiving an expected invitation to a foxhunt.

Time, 3/24/61 reports that a fox was treed and "this didn't
make Mrs. Kennedy too happy." Does that mean that she would have
preferred to see it torn to pieces by the dogs? Did she resent
the "invasions of her privacy" by voters who bitterly objected to
her great love for this cruel sport?
