Captioned individual has sent four letters to the Director, two of which were received on December 14th and the remaining two on December 15th. While he had signed them by captioned name, the envelopes in which they were transmitted have the name Walter Whickell affixed in captioned individual's handwriting.

Although he indicates confidence in the FBI, his communications are generally non-sensical and reflect he may be suffering from mental instability. He registers suspicion of CIA which he states was set up by "Warren and Company" and that its secrecy enables it to serve communists most ably. He also expresses a distrust for President Johnson and the handling of President Kennedy's assassination which he alleges was a conspiracy between "L. B. J. and Hoifa." He also feels that he is under surveillance by a cab company in the area and alleges that the city is a "cesspool full of Castros."

[REDACTED] is not identifiable in Bufiles and in view of the general content of his letters, it is not felt that any response or action by this Bureau is warranted. Accordingly, his communications will not be acknowledged.

RECOMMENDATION:

That captioned individual's communications not be acknowledged.
