5-1134 ((1-" 3-65)  $\frown$ Domestic Intelligence Division INFORMATIVE NOTE 5/8/67 Date SUMMARY Carlos Quiroga, referred to in attached, is an anti-Castro Cuban national who visited the home of Lee Harvey Oswald in August, 1963 after Oswald distributed Fair Play for Cuba literature on the streets of New Orleans. Quiroga subsequently explained that he was interested in determining Oswald's extent of participation in the Fair Play for Cuba group and learned that that Oswald was a dedicated pro-Castro worker. He reported this to the New Orleans police at the time and offered to act as an informant but the police were not interested. Quiroga has advised that he has told Garrison of his visit to Oswald's home and how he learned that Oswald was working for the pro-Castro Cuban cause. However, Garrison apparently ignored the explanation Quiroga gave him about Oswald's pro-Castro activity and chose , to believe that inasmuch as Quiroga is and was an anti-Castro Cuban worker, Oswald too was an anti-Castro worker. Garrison has apparently attempted to force Quiroga to testify that Oswald was working with anti-Castro forces. TJS:ts
