Enclosed for Los Angeles are seven photographs made by CIA in 1963 of an unknown individual who visited the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City. These photographs, and/or existence of same, must not be revealed to anyone outside the Bureau in order to protect the CIA source. Los Angeles note that one of these photographs was printed on page 636 of volume XVI of the Hearings Before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy.

Enclosed also for Los Angeles are two copies of photographs of [redacted] made in 1955 when [redacted]

It appears to the Bureau from a comparison of the photographs that [redacted] is not the unknown visitor to the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City. [redacted] possesses a noticeable dimple on his chin whereas the unknown visitor to the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City, does not. [redacted] ears grow close to his head whereas the unknown's ears protrude to a noticeable extent.

Before closing this matter, however, the Bureau desires that Los Angeles Agents acquainted with [redacted] view the CIA pictures and furnish observations as to whether or not they depict [redacted]. If deemed necessary, arrange to view [redacted] unknown to him, and compare with the photographs of the unknown subject. Furnish observations to Bureau.

NOTE: CIA forwarded to us for whatever action we deemed appropriate a letter containing an allegation that the CIA photograph printed by the Warren Commission resembled one [redacted]. The CIA photographs were made of an individual, who has never been identified, who visited the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City, in October, 1963. Early in the assassination investigation, CIA furnished to us the photographs as possibly being of Oswald. The [redacted] is [redacted] now a resident of California. He has been interviewed by Los Angeles Agents. From a comparison of the photographs, it does not appear [redacted] is the unknown visitor, but Los Angeles Agents who have seen [redacted] are in a better position than we are to judge this. If [redacted] was the man who visited the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City, then further investigation of him is warranted. The above should resolve the basic question.
