DA to Answer 4 Shaw Attacks On Evidence

neys immediately disputed the allegation. Garrison has indicated his investigation is moving toward the possibility that persons — especially anti-Castro Cubans angry with Kennedy — employed by the CIA were responsible for the late President's slaying.

Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison planned to file his formal reply in Criminal District Court today to show cause why evidence against Clay L. Shaw should not be suppressed.

Attorneys for the 54-year-old accused presidential assassination conspirator attacked the Garrison case on four legal fronts last week.

They asked that the indictment against Shaw be dismissed and requested that certain evidence in Garrison's possession be suppressed.

THE STATE WAS given 30 days to reply, but sources close to the DA's office said the first of its answers will be filed sometime this morning.

Shaw is the only person indicted in Garrison's investigation of what he contends was a New Orleans based plot to murder Kennedy at Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

When Shaw was arrested March 1, his handsome French Quarter home was searched by a dozen DA's men who carried away five cartons of materials.

THE SHAW motions asked for the return of the seized material and the suppression of it as evidence.

Yesterday, Garrison renewed his attack on the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency which he has said is deeply involved in the plot probe.

He charged that lawyers for some of the principals in the investigation are being paid by the CIA. Two attor-
