Reference is made to Tampa memorandum captioned
as above and dated May 15, 1967.

On May 18, 1967, Mr. ROBERT J. HAIMAN, Managing
Editor, "St. Petersburg Times," a St. Petersburg, Florida,
daily newspaper, furnished to the FBI a letter which he
(HAIMAN) had received. The following is the substance of
