By letter dated May 31, 1967, the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) furnished the following additional information concerning the letter sent by New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison on May 22, 1967, to Special Agent in Charge Robert E. Rightmyer of the New Orleans Office of this Bureau.

DIA has had no contact with "Jim Garrison," District Attorney, Parish of Orleans. DIA also has had no contact with a "Mr. Weiss" or with "Gordon Novel." There has been no contact by DIA with the Attorneys Plotkin, Alvarez and Sapir. DIA, having no contact with any of these individuals and no contact with the Louisiana Army National Guard, is unable to interpret the meaning of the remarks pertaining to it which appeared in the enclosure furnished by Garrison. DIA has no personnel stationed in New Orleans and no personnel stationed in the State of Louisiana.
