INFORMATIVE NOTE

Date 6/1/67

At the time of Clay L. Shaw's arrest by Jim Garrison on a charge of conspiring to assassinate John F. Kennedy, five cardboard boxes of papers and personal effects of Shaw were seized as evidence.

Shaw's attorneys have tried unsuccessfully to have these personal effects returned to Shaw. In answer to a motion in early May, 1967 demanding return of the items, Garrison announced that he had broken a code used by Lee Harvey Oswald and as a result learned that the unlisted telephone number of Jack Ruby appeared in both the notebook of Oswald and a notebook of Clay L. Shaw.

Garrison indicated that he would be able to link other evidence seized from Shaw to the assassination conspiracy.

Since the information in attached is a summary of information in the news media, it will not be disseminated.
