whether the alleged perjury by Andrews comes under the heading of Article 123, which refers to willful falsehoods, or Article 124, which deals with contra-dictory statements.

Judge Shea is also expected to rule Monday on a motion to quash the indictment against Andrews. This was filed previsarela ha-Zelden.
