ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY,
NOVEMBER 22, 1963, DALLAS,
TEXAS

Richard Halstead, Wyoming Highway Patrolman, Wamsutter, Wyoming, telephonically furnished the following information on June 4, 1967, to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation:

At about 10:30 p.m., June 3, 1967, he stopped a 1955 Buick, two door hardtop, dark green over white in color, bearing Nevada license W 68105, on Interstate Highway 80 near Wamsutter, because the car had only one illuminated headlight. A ticket was given to the driver but he is not required to appear in court and is merely required to have the faulty headlight repaired in the next town, Rawlins, Wyoming.

The driver, who was traveling alone, identified himself as Gerald Lee Morrison, and said he was traveling to Washington, D. C., to see Senator Robert Kennedy, since he had information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Morrison stated that he had talked with Lee Harvey Oswald, and had been questioned by the FBI in Salt Lake City. Morrison's Nevada driver's license, number GN 410528, disclosed he was born May 28, 1941, is a white male, 5 feet 10 inches tall, weight 165 pounds, blond hair and blue eyes. His residence address is 332 Colorado River Boulevard, Reno, Nevada.

A bill of sale revealed he had purchased the 1955 Buick, VIN 4B4019734, on June 11, 1966, from Scott Motor Co., 2401 South Virginia, Reno, Nevada.
