The Bureau has reviewed the tape recording furnished by the Jackson Office. For information of recipients, the contents appear to be telephone coversations of Gordon Novel with several persons, including "Mr. Robertson," possibly Willard Robertson who has previously been mentioned as one of Garrison's financial backers. The tape recording contained no pertinent Information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy and hence, no copies are being prepared for interested offices, his bearing a second attache case apparently the property of Gordon Novel was found at an airport in Gulfport, Mississippi. The contents the attache case were made available to the Jackson Office and The contents of copies were prepared and furnished to the Bureau. ' A spool of wire from a wire recorder was in the case and Jackson made a tape from this. Jackson submitted the tape as well as copies of the other material in the attache case to the Bureau and suggested that the Bureau might desire to prepare copies of the tape for NO and DL. Since the tape contained no pertinent information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy, it is unnecessary to furnish DL and NO copies of it. The above notifies them that this is not being done.
