At 12:45 A.M., June 28, 1967, Mr. Paul Teegarden, Box 107, Rayville, Missouri, (presently in Room 623, Research Hospital, 63rd and Prospect, Kansas City, Missouri), telephonically contacted the Kansas City FBI Office, advising as follows:

He stated that he had read in the newspaper that a homosexual had been arrested regarding the assassination of President Kennedy. Mr. Teegarden also advised that he had read there was interest in proof that Lee Harvey Oswald was in New Orleans in 1961.

Mr. Teegarden advised that he was staying in the Union Hotel, New Orleans, Louisiana, in September of 1961, and remembers seeing a man who looked very much like Oswald, that was staying there also. Mr. Teegarden also stated that the hotel was run by a homosexual with a first name or nickname of "Elmer." The exact location of the Union Hotel was unknown, but it was somewhere close to Canal Street in New Orleans.
