Reference is made to your letter dated October 31, 1967, "FMV:KT:bkg, 129-11," which enclosed a letter addressed to the Attorney General from Mr. Terry Christie, Instructor in History and Political Science, Dalton Junior College, Dalton, Georgia, dated October 18, 1967.

You requested this Bureau to formulate and send Mr. Christie an appropriate reply. In order to fully resolve this matter, Mr. Christie is going to be interviewed to establish the identity of the Southern Methodist University Professor who alleged that on the night preceding the assassination, November 21, 1963, he was staying with friends who were neigh-bors of Jack Ruby and that Lee Harvey Oswald came to their door asking for Ruby's residence. At the time Mr. Christie is interviewed, his letter will be acknowledged.

When the identity of the Southern Nethodist University Professor is established, he will be interviewed, and the results of these interviews will be furnished to you upon receipt.
