MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

In connection with a 7:30 p. m. , newscast 11-15-67, Dr. Josiah Thompson, Assistant Professor of Philosophy at Haverford College, Haverford, Pennsylvania, and author of forthcoming book "Six Seconds in Dallas" dealing with his investigation of the assassination, was reported as stating that he volunteered his observations on the assassination to the FBI in 1966. Thompson has allegedly stated that the Warren Commission's conclusion concerning the assassination of President Kennedy was too pat for him so he decided to do some research on his own.

ACTION:

Night Supervisor Darwin Bare, Philadelphia Office, was telephonically contacted at 9:50 p. m. , 11-15-67, for the purpose of having the files of that office searched as to whether Thompson had ever been contacted by representatives of the Philadelphia Office with regard to his views on the assassination of President Kennedy. He was instructed to submit this information by teletype night of 11-15-67.
