Dear Sir:

In the Warren Report, no mention was made of certain aspects of the complete Altgens photograph of the assassination of the late President Kennedy. A cropped version was used in the Warren Report, thus omitting valuable information (Warren Commission Exhibit #900).

In the complete version, which was printed in the December 14, 1963 issue of the SATURDAY EVENING POST and Harold Weisberg's books WHITEWASH and WHITEWASH II, Lee Harvey Oswald is seen standing in the Texas School-Book Depository Entrance. The Warren Report stated that this was Billy Nolan Lovelady. The photograph shows the man (Lovelady or Oswald) in a seemingly course knit shirt open half-way to the waist and wearing a tee-shirt underneath. Also, the man's hairline is the same as Oswald's. Photographs taken of Oswald after his arrest show him in the same shirt as the one worn by the figure in the Texas School-Book Depository Entrance. The Warren Report dismissed this photograph as one showing Frank Nolan Lovelady in the TSBDE entrance. Yet, Lovelady swore that he was wearing a red and white striped shirt buttoned to the collar on the day of the assassination. P

What are your comments on this, and what evidence have you to substantiate your claims?

Also, in the complete Altgens photograph is the Dal-Tex Building located to the extreme right. On the fire-escape adjacent to the Dal-Tex Building is a man, seemingly in distress. Just below him is a rifle-like structure emerging from the window. Was this man and rifle-like structure investigated? If so, what was determined? If it was not investigated, please tell me why not.
