For information of Bureau and Dallas, [redacted] was coherent during the interview.

Baltimore Office files reflect a judgment filed by the United States of America vs. [redacted] on 12/19/58, in the Circuit Court of Baltimore County, in the amount of \$678.76. The file does not show the nature of this judgment and has no additional identifying information.

On 2/2/54, [redacted] made a complaint to the Baltimore Office that one [redacted] a Baptist Minister, aided [redacted] wife in breaking into his home following a divorce and removed articles of furniture belonging to her. At that time, [redacted] alleged that [redacted] made a remark that he "belonged to the FBI". Investigation determined this to be either a misinterpreted or facetious comment.

In articles appearing in the Baltimore Sun, 8/14/59, and the Afro-American, 8/15/69, information was reported that the NAACP had asked the State Board of Public Welfare to disregard a ruling of the Attorney General of Maryland and begin integration of Maryland's four training schools for delinquents. Opposing integration of the schools was one [REDACTED] who said he was appearing here in my own interest as a tax payer to protest the Board holding a hearing on this question when the Attorney General has already ruled on it".
