- Did Garrison tell you that Perrie passed a Lie Detector Test, and according to the test was not involved in the conspiracy to kill the President?

Observations:

The above relevant questions were asked several times, two or more, and except for slight variations if a word or two which did not basically change or alter the questions were as stated above, and his answers were as given in parenthesis, with the exception he was very emphatic on several.

It is the opinion of this examiner, after careful analysis of all Polygrams, this subjects answers as stated to the above questions did not generally denote specific deception, and therefore would be considered as truthful answers.
