Enid Man Called To Testify In New Orleans Probe Of Kennedy Assessingtion Disputes Information Given To Warren Commission

> A man whom the Warren Commission liunted for many months has just returned to E. id from a visit with District Automay Jim Garrison in New Orleans.

Garrison is conducting his own investigation of the Nov. 22, 1953, assassination of President John F. Konnedy. The Warren Report is the U.S. Government's

official investigation summary of the assassination.

The Enid man involved in the Incident is James Ilicks, 28, of 1713 E. Cedar, who was standing less than 100 yards from the Kennedy auto when the president was shot to death.

Hicks does not know how I Garrison of New Orleans found out Hicks' name. But Hicks'

picture appears in Volume XII, of the Warren Report, taken' while he was standing on the grass watching the Kennedy auto race down the street immediately after the shooting.
