In further reference to our memorandum of December 1, 1967, in the above actions, this memorandum will serve to confirm a number of conversations between William A. Gershuny of the Civil Division and Special Agent Kenneth M. Raupach at which time we were advised that the information relating to the exhibits which are the subject matter of the action filed by Mrs. Porter is not readily ascertainable from the voluminous reports of the Bureau relating to the assassination and that to compile such information concerning each of the several hundred exhibits would require a considerable amount of time on the part of the Bureau. In view of these circumstances, we ask that nothing further be done in this regard at this time.

With reference to the rifle and the revolver which are the subject matter of the suits brought by Mr. King, we are now in possession of your letter of November 23, 1965 to Fred M. Vinson, Jr., forwarding a chronology reflecting the location of the rifle and revolver during the period from November 22, 1963 to November 18, 1965.
