"Mr. Hicks may have special the deknowledge concerning the de-tails of the assassination with respect to its planning and ex-ecution as well as personnel employed in the assassination of the President," Mr. Garri-son said in a statement deliv-lated from his office. ered from his office.

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Jan. 4 (AP)—A professional lie detector consultant said today that results of fests he gave Edgar Eugene Bradley indicate Mr. Bradley did not plot the murder of President Kennedy.

Mr. Bradley, 49 years old, is accused by Mr. Garrison of conspiring with Clay Shaw, 54, to kill Mr. Kennedy.
