**U.S. WORKER CALLED
IN KENNEDY 'PLOT'**

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 4 (UPI) — District Attorney Jim Garrison of New Orleans today subpoenaed a Federal civil service employe he said "may have special knowledge" of the assassination of President Kennedy.

The subpoena to appear before the Orleans Parish (County) grand jury went to a man identified as James Hicks, a civilian employe at Vance Air Force Base in Enid, Okla.

Mr. Garrison said that Mr. Hicks was at the scene the day Mr. Kennedy was shot in Dallas.

"Mr. Hicks may have special knowledge concerning the details of the assassination with respect to its planning and execution as well as personnel employed in the assassination of the President," Mr. Garrison said in a statement delivered from his office.

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Jan. 4 (AP) — A professional lie detector consultant said today that results of tests he gave Edgar Eugene Bradley indicate Mr. Bradley did not plot the murder of President Kennedy.

Mr. Bradley, 49 years old, is accused by Mr. Garrison of conspiring with Clay Shaw, 54, to kill Mr. Kennedy.

Chris Gugas, of Professional Security Consultants, told a news conference here that he has administered nine tests to Mr. Bradley.

Following disclosure of the tests, Mr. Bradley challenged Mr. Garrison to take similar tests.
