The Orleans Parish Grand Jury, at the request of District Attorney Jim Garrison, has subpenaed an Oklahoma man as a material witness in the DA's probe of the Kennedy assassination.

The man has been identified as James Hicks, a civil service employe at Vance Air Force Base in Enid, Okla. He lives at 1713 Cedar st. there.

His Cedar St. unere, Garrison said yesterday that Hicks, although not listed by the Warren Commission as among those present at the scene of the assassination, "nevertheless was there when President Kennedy was mardered."

HE ADDED THAT Hicks may have special knowledge about the planning, execution and people involved in the assassination,

1 THE 43-YEAR-OLD Bradley is accused of conspiring with New Orleans businessman Clay Shaw to kill Kennedy in Dallas. Both say they are innoicent, and, further, that they do not know each other.

Bradley is employed by Dr. Carl McIntire, president of the International Council of Christian Churches, who said yesterday he will kick off a fundraising campaign for Bradley, who is free on his own recognizance pending a request for his <u>extradition</u> to <u>New Or-</u> leans.
