On January 9, 1968, an individual who identified himself as United States Air Force Special Police, Andrews Air Force Base, Maryland, telephonically contacted a Special Agent of the Washington Field Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation from the Colony Restaurant, Scranton, Pennsylvania, to advise that he knows the identity of deceased President John F. Kennedy's assassin; however, he would not divulge the name over the telephone. Istated he had been working on the "Kennedy case" for a long time and has served at times, at Andrews Air Force Base, in a unit charged with the protection of the United States President.

When asked if he had furnished the above information to his commanding officer, stated he did not because he feared that officer may be involved in the Kennedy assassination; besides he, had recently designed a successful modification to a rifle currently used by the United States Armed Forces, which this officer refused to accept.

Base from Pennsylvania on the evening of January 9, 1968. He refused to further discuss the matter or furnish any other information indicating he preferred to be contacted personally.
