ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY
NOVEMBER 22, 1963
DALLAS, TEXAS

Reference is made to your letter dated October 21, 1967, "FIV:KT:bkg: 129-11," and my letter dated November 9, 1967, concerning [redacted], Instructor in History and Political Science, Dalton Junior College, Dalton, Georgia. You are also referred to memoranda dated November 13, 1967, Atlanta, Georgia, and December 4, 1967, Dallas, Texas, which reveal results of interviews with Mr. Terry Christie, [redacted] and [redacted], Dean of the School of Arts, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas. These memoranda were furnished to you on December 7, 1967.

In connection with the inquiries conducted regarding this matter the original allegation was that [redacted] visited relatives in Dallas, Texas, and allegedly on November 21, 1963, the night preceding the assassination of President Kennedy, an individual came to the door asking for the residence of Jack Ruby and it was thought this individual was Lee Harvey Oswald.

As previously reported, [redacted] mentioned that [redacted], who apparently originated the allegation, was unknown to him but he may have met her during one of his numerous trips in connection with his profession. He further related that he felt [redacted] was confused. He did indicate the information he had received regarding this matter was furnished to him by his brother-in-law, [redacted] who had obtained the information from an associate of his named [redacted].

In order to resolve this matter completely [redacted] and [redacted] were interviewed.

Enclosed for your information are two copies of a memorandum dated January 8, 1968, Dallas, Texas, containing the results of these interviews. It is noted that an individual described as a large red-haired person, possibly a truck driver,

did appear at [redacted] home on either November 23 or 24, 1963, looking for the superintendent of the "Dallas Book Depository Building." [redacted] also mentioned that this incident had nothing whatsoever to do with the assassination of President Kennedy, Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby.

Your attention is invited to the fact this incident took place subsequent to the assassination of President Kennedy and not on November 21, 1963, as originally alleged. In view of this information, no further action is being taken by this Bureau.

NOTE: The Department previously furnished a copy of the letter addressed to the Attorney General from [redacted] [redacted] was interviewed and his letter to the Attorney General acknowledged. He indicated he merely wrote to the Attorney General for [redacted] who allegedly received information from [redacted] that Lee Harvey Oswald came to the door of a relative of his in Dallas, Texas, on 11/21/63, seeking the residence of Jack Ruby. [redacted] was interviewed in Dallas and advised there was no substance to [redacted] story and that she apparently was confused. He further stated he did not recall her but probably met her during one of his trips connected with his profession. He identified his brother-in-law who was interviewed as was his close associate [redacted] at whose residence the incident occurred. This incident occurred subsequent to the assassination of President Kennedy and according to [redacted] and [redacted] when it did occur, at no time during the evening was any mention made of Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby. In view of this, no further action is being taken.
