Thank you for your letter of January 6, 1968. Your generous comments regarding the work of this Bureau and my administration of it are indeed appreciated. I certainly hope our future endeavors will merit your continued support.

The FBI at the request of President Johnson conducted a prompt, intensive, objective and thorough investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy. All the material developed by this Bureau in connection with this investigation was turned over to the Warren Commission for its consideration, and the results of our inquiry were subsequently made available to the National Archives by the Warren Commission. The FBI has no authority to independently release any information in these reports.
