Department referred a letter written by [REDACTED] who resides in Long Island, New York. He indicated he has witnessed bombings, shootings, and numerous felonious assaults. In addition, he indicated he has been shot more than 20 times. He stated he was familiar with President John F. Kennedy and has eye-witness testimony as to President Kennedy's activities in the 1930's which may have caused his death. From the tone of his letter it appears that he may be mentally incompetent and New York is requested to check indices so that the Department's letter can be appropriately acknowledged.
